For more than 50 years, Meals on Wheels has delivered countless meals to homebound seniors in our community. Every delivery brings not only nourishment but also dignity, safety, connection, and hope, one meal, one smile, one neighbor at a time. Now more than ever, we are seeing the need for this critical service rise, leading to a growing waitlist.

Meals on Wheels Summit, Utah & Wasatch was created in 2023 as a fundraising arm of the long-standing Meals on Wheels program serving Summit, Utah, and Wasatch counties. Thanks to the generosity of our community and dedicated volunteers, we have been able to reduce the waiting list by 30%. Our goal is to eliminate it completely.

Together, we are ending the wait.

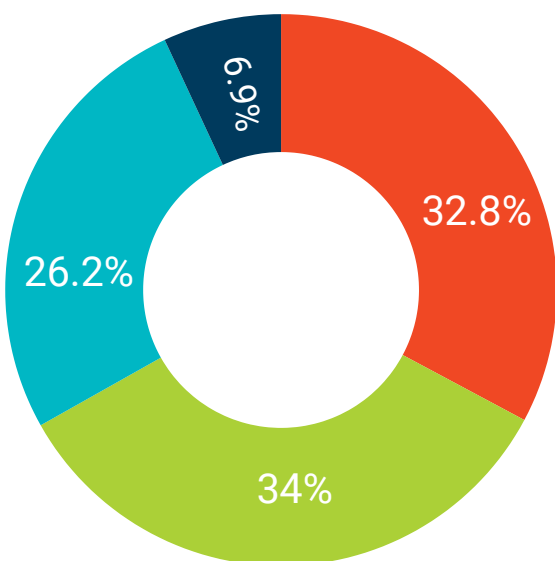
